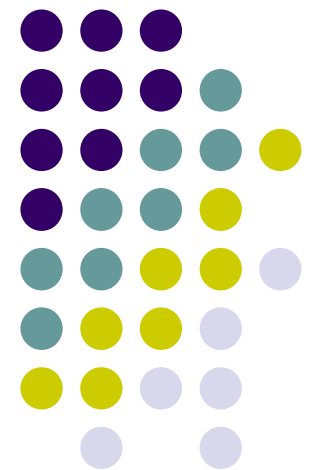
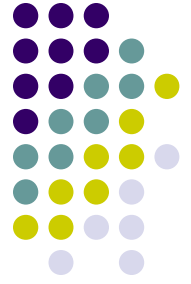

- Favorable on college application.



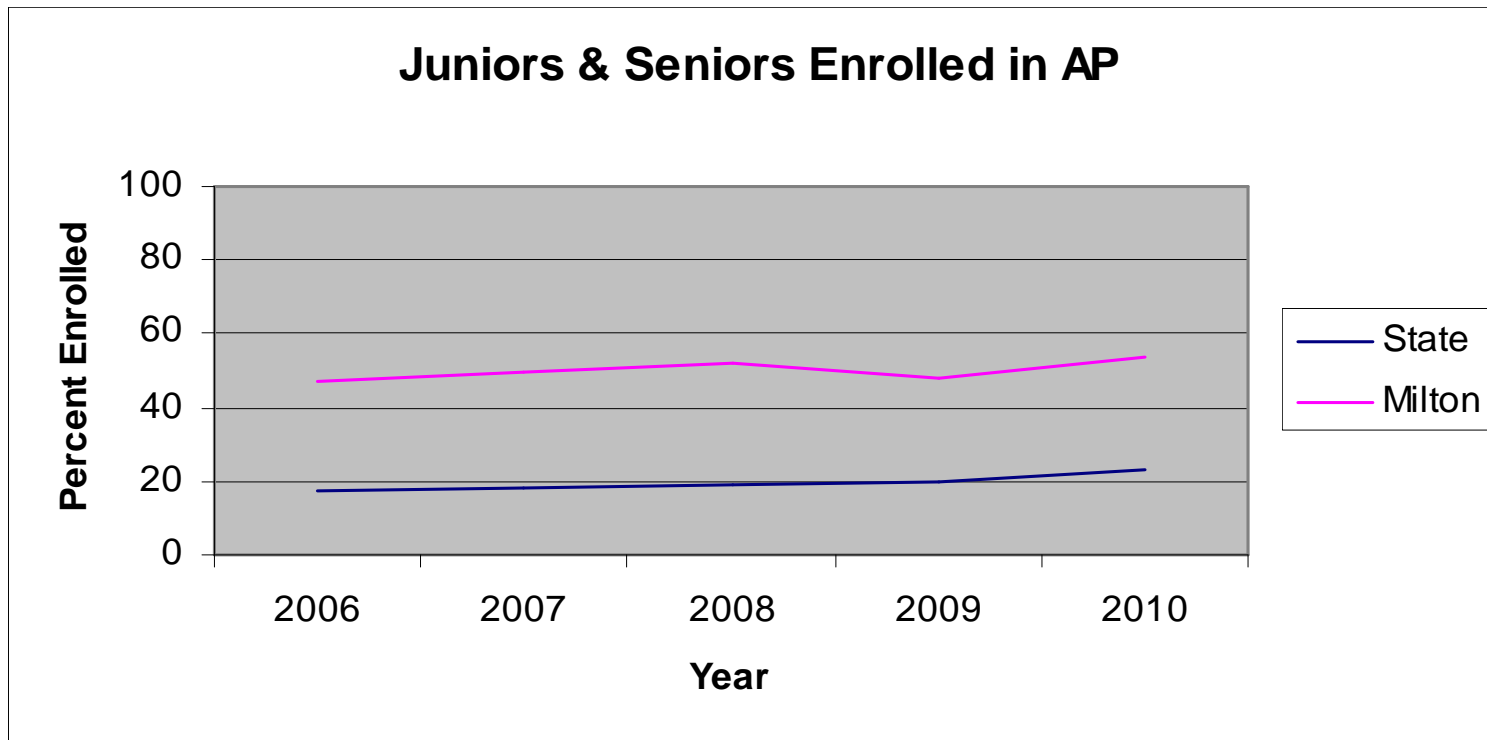
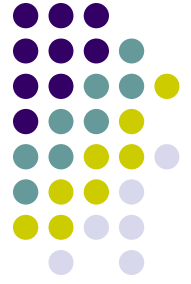
AP Results 2011 Exams

The following chart shows the Advancement Placement (AP) test scores of Milton High School juniors and seniors from 2001-2011. Advanced Placement tests are scored from 5 (top score) to 1 (low score). Students who qualify for college credit score 3, 4, or 5 on the test.

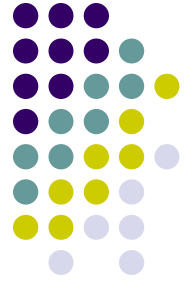

Highlights of AP Success 2011



- 276 test takers in 2011
- Total of 584 AP exams taken in 2011

11th and 12 graders taking AP

- Percentage of juniors who took AP: 38%
- Percentage of seniors who took AP: 61%

- Each student takes an average of 2 AP exams but some take far more.

AP Success at Milton High



- 21% of test takers were students of color.
- 46% **increase** in the number of students of color taking AP over the past 2 years.
- 23% **increase** in the number of tests qualifying (scoring 3, 4 or 5) - compared to a 10% increase at the state level and an 8% increase on the national level



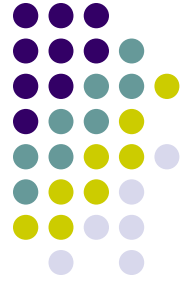
AP Success at Milton High

- 23% of those students scoring 3,4 or 5 were students of color.
- 29% **increase** in the number of Black test takers scoring 3, 4 or 5 compared to last year.
- **Milton consistently outpaces the state AP course enrollment** by approximately 27% year after year going back to 2006.



AP Scholars 2011

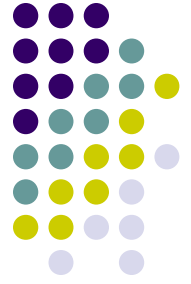
- **73 Milton High School students earned an AP Scholar Award.**
- The AP Program offers several AP Scholar Awards to recognize high school students who have demonstrated college-level achievement through AP courses and exams.



AP Scholars

- **44 AP Scholar Awards** - students who received scores of 3 or higher on three or more AP Exams.
- **13 AP Scholar with Honor Awards** - students who received an average score of at least 3.5 on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on four or more of these exams.

AP Scholars



- **15 AP Scholars with Distinction Award** - students who received an average score of at least 3.5 on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on five or more of these exams.
- **One National AP Scholar Award Recipient** - students in the U.S. who receive an average score of at least 4 on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 4 or higher on eight or more of these exams.
