As many of you know, March is "Music in Our Schools Month" (MIOSM). Here in the Milton Public Schools, we strive to give our students a well-rounded education. Exposure to music and the arts are critical components of our educational program.

Our music department is widely recognized as one of the best in the area. Thanks to the residents of this town, along with the generosity of the Copeland Family Foundation, our music classrooms are well equipped. The Copeland donations include two music labs, one at Milton High and one at Pierce. These labs have digital pianos with computers attached so students can use software that lets them write music, practice theory, learn to play the piano, etc. In addition, the Copeland Foundation donated musical instruments for the strings and band. They have also donated a digital piano at Tucker, Glover, Pierce and MHS for music class, along with acoustic pianos at Tucker, Glover, and MHS for chorus and music class. The Copeland Family Foundation refurbished the original grand piano at MHS in the auditorium, financed the acoustical shell for the MHS auditorium and donated Orff instruments for Glover and Tucker music classes.

Despite such generosity, the music department – along with our other school departments – has struggled to maintain its high standards during budget cutbacks. For example, in the past few years, we have eliminated our 4th and 5th grade weekly chorus class. We have also reduced music to a half-year course for 3rd, 4th and 5th graders and eliminated band class for the elementary school bands, who now must practice during lunch and recess.

However, many of our students continue to thrive in our programs and there is no better example of this success than our March concerts. Please review the list below and make a point to come and support our wonderful music students.

As educators, we are well aware of the correlation between arts education and improved academic success. There are many studies which show that music education enhances the same higher brain function required for mathematics, chess, science and engineering. In addition, participation in musical groups such as concert, band or chorus teaches students how to work cooperatively, solve problems and realize the link between effort and quality of result. For these reasons and many others, we strive to support music education in our schools.

I would also like to publicly recognize and thank our music teachers:

***Gary Good** teaches Electronic Keyboard Lab I and II, Concert Band; and teaches the elementary bands at all four schools. **Rebecca Damiani** teaches General Music Classes at MHS, as well as Concert Band, and Jazz Ensemble. **Patricia Ostrem** teaches grades 4-12 string ensemble. **Lauren Kapalka** teaches General Music, Concert Band, and Jazz Ensemble at Pierce Middle School. **Dawn Sykes** teaches General Music and all choruses at Pierce. **April Allegrezza** teaches at the four elementary schools -- half the year at Glover/Tucker and half the year at Collicot/Cunningham. **Rebecca Cherry** teaches at the four elementary schools - half the year at Glover/Tucker and half the year at Collicot/Cunningham.*

*Finally, I would like to recognize **Dr. Noreen Diamond Burdett**, Director of Fine and Applied Arts, who teaches Mixed Chorus, Girls Chorus and AP Theory at Milton High and directs the four after-school vocal*

School Committee Update

The last SC meeting was held on Tuesday, March 9th. Below is a summary of this meeting. In addition to its regular meetings the School Committee held an Open Budget Hearing on March 16th.

The meeting began with recognition of the Milton High School Boys' Basketball team and their coach, Sean LoPresti. The team won the Bay State League Championship and competed in the Division 2 South Sectional Finals. School Committee members congratulated the team on their season.

Next, as part of the Superintendent's Report, Bill Ritchie, Facilities Director, gave a report to the school committee. Mr. Ritchie discussed the success of the MHS solar panels and reported that a 210-panel array will be installed on the Cunningham/Collicot roof. He also went over his efforts to use "green" cleaning products in our schools, his preventative maintenance schedule, staffing needs, field maintenance, and energy conservation efforts. Curriculum Information

Reminder! There will be no school for students on **Friday, March 19th**, as this is a Professional Development Day for our teaching staff.

As many of you know, the MCAS exams will begin during the next few weeks. Students in grades three through eight and grade ten will participate in the English Language Arts, Mathematics and Science, Technology & Engineering sessions at some point during testing windows in March, April, May, and June. High school students will take the science MCAS the first week of June. Please check your school's website for exact dates. Please try to avoid scheduling any out-of-town trips, doctor's appointments or other planned absences during these exams. Here are some other notes on MCAS:

- The English Language Arts MCAS test sessions will take place some time during the March 22nd - April 12th, 2010 testing window, depending on the school and grade level. This exam consists of a series of reading passages followed by multiple choice questions and open response questions. Open response questions require the students to generate a written response in the form of a paragraph or a chart or table as appropriate.
- Students in Grades 4, 7, & 10 are also required to participate in the English Language Arts Composition Test. This requires students to respond to a prompt by creating a written composition.
- New to the Grade 3 exam is short-answer questions, which require the students to generate a brief response or statement.
- The Math portion and Science portions of the MCAS will take place during the month of May and early June. We will explain more about the math and science testing procedures in the next E-blast.
