2014-2015 SEPAC Committees Advocacy/Advisory

MA Statute & Regs authorize PAC to:

- Provide advice to the district regarding its special education programs and policies including recommendations to those parties in the district responsible for overseeing special education, including the special education director, the superintendent, and the school committee.
- Meet at regular intervals with designated school officials and to engage in other activities which enable the PAC to participate in the planning, development, and evaluation of the district's special education programs.



SEPAC Member Concerns

- Criteria used to determine ESY and extended day services
- Lack of social opportunities and inclusion
- Co-taught classroom: resources/supports
- Funding/lack of resources cited as reason student cannot receive particular services
- Unclear and/or unwritten district policies
- Competency portfolios for MCAS/accommodations for PARRC assessment
