





Grade 4 MCAS Data





Grade 5 MCAS Data





Tucker School MCAS 2013 Data Observations Review



- 65% of ALL students were Proficient or Advanced in *ELA*;
 70% of ALL students were Proficient or Advanced in *Math*
- 83% of Grade 3 students were Proficient or Advanced in *Math*
- Students in Grade 3 & 5 outperformed the state.
- There was a significant increase in ELA & Math from Gr.4-5
- There was a lack of growth from Gr. 3-4. Students in grade 4 did not outperform the state (ELA 46/53; Math 51/52).

Tucker School -MCAS 2013 Data Observations Review

- There is a significant gap between the High Needs* subgroup and Non-High Needs students in Grades 3-5 in *ELA* and *Math*.
- In Grade 5 Science there exists a gap between the High Needs* subgroup and Non-High Needs students at the advanced level.

Grade 5 Science	Non-High Needs	High Needs
Advanced	27%	11%
Proficient	27%	33%

- Grade 3 & 4 African American/Black Students had higher percentages of students Proficient or higher in Math.
- Grade 5 African American/Black Students outperformed the state in all areas

^{*}High Needs subgroup includes students with disabilities, students identified as low income, and English Language Learners (ELL)

Milton Public Schools Elementary Initiatives Closing Proficiency Gaps

- Streamlining the Gr.1-4 RTI structure to strengthen supports to students in both English & French
- Incorporating both a Morning ELA and a Morning Math Title I program to support students.
- Vacation week *Tucker Prep Academy* structured and designed to support students "on the bubble" academically in Grade 4 & 5 using MCAS and benchmark data.
- The Diversity Committee and Site Council will be looking at research initiatives from COSEBOC (Coalition of Schools Educating Boys of Color) to determine best practices for a mentoring program following their Annual gathering of leaders in April 2014


Milton Public Schools Elementary Initiatives Advancing Science and STEM



- Community partnership with "Planting More" grant to develop an outdoor classroom and accompanying curriculum for our students




Milton Public Schools Elementary Initiatives Early Literacy-Grade 1 & 2 English Assessment Data


