Club Description: The three components to the Future Problem Solving Program (FPSP) are: Teams of four students learn a six-step problem solving process which they then apply, along with their research on specific topics, to solve social and scientific problems. A "future scene" prompts students to explore challenges as they refine their critical and creative thinking skills, focus on one problem area to solve, produce solution ideas, generate criteria to evaluate their solutions, and develop an action plan. Students complete a Qualifying Problem (QP) in one two-hour time period without assistance from their coach and the top teams in the state are invited to the State Bowl in April, where they compete for the opportunity to represent Massachusetts at the FPSP International Conference in June. All students who plan on participating in the program must commit to attending our meetings every Tuesday.
