Dolphins! Dolphins!

Have you ever heard of a Vaquita? Well probably not. Vaquitas are dolphin-like creatures called porpoises. One thing to know about them is that they are endangered. Like super endangered. As a matter of fact, they're critically endangered. Scientists estimate that there are only six to 22 left in the wild! To help with this, the Mexican government led the vaquita CPR project. In this case CPR means Conservation, Protection, and Recovery.



Another type of endangered dolphin is the Maui dolphin. The Maui dolphin lives of the coast of New Zealand. Scientists say there are about 63 to 55 of them left in the wild. One of the subspecies of the Maui dolphin is the Hector's dolphin. The hector's dolphin is the smallest dolphin known to man. Both the Vaquita and the Maui/Hector's dolphin are very cute and very endangered.

Easy Pom-Poms for a Boring Day

These super easy pom-poms can be made in 12 simple steps. All you need is yarn, scissors, two hands, and moderate patience.

Hope you enjoy making your own pom-poms! Use thicker yarn to make bigger pom-poms, or only use two fingers to make smaller ones. Use two colors (or more) of yarn at once to make multicolored pom-poms.

Make a pom-pom!

- 1. Wrap yarn around 3 fingers (make sure not to wrap too tight)
- 2. Cut another piece of yarn, about six inches long
- 3. Push the yarn in between your fingers and the wrapped yarn
- 4. Slide the wrapped yarn off of your fingers

5. Tie the six-inch piece around the rest of the yarn

6. Flip the circle-ish shape over and tie it twice on that side

7. If you want to, you can flip it over again and tie it again

8. Go get your scissors (they need to be sharp)


9. Cut through the loops in the circle-ish shape

10. Repeat step 9 on the other side

11. Trim the pom-pom as short as you want, or just enough so it is even on all sides

12. You now have a pom-pom!
