




## MHS Student Assets

Of the 50 YRBS risk indicators studied, Milton students performed better than the rest of the state in 41 of them.







Rates of alcohol consumption, marijuana use, vaping, and prescription drug misuse decreased at MHS between 2019 and 2022.


MHS students reported *strong relations* with adults in their lives, including school staff

Nearly all types of *violence* are lower than the rest of the state

Rates of engaging in *risky sexual behaviors* are significantly lower in Milton

## **Alcohol Use**




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- More than 50% of MHS students said it was "sort of easy" or "very easy" to get cigarettes
- Compared to 2019, ever use of an EVP has decreased from 48% to 26% in 2022 at MHS



#### Ever took Rx drugs without doctor's prescription






• 25% of MHS students reported ever being treated badly due to race/ethnicity in school




## PMS Student Assets

Of the 42 YHS risk indicators studied, Milton students performed better than the rest of the state in 35 of them.










Rates of alcohol consumption, marijuana use and vaping are lower than the state and rates of alcohol consumption and vaping have decreased from 2019 to 2022 at Pierce Middle School.

PMS students demonstrated positive social norms. When compared to MA students, PMS students were less likely to think that most peers used substances.

Low rates of riding with a driver who was operating under the influence of alcohol or marijuana.


Almost all PMS students reported positive, protective relationship with family/caregiver and a sense of belonging at school


### **Mental Health**



• Overall, male and female students reported that they experienced bullying and engaged in cyberbullying at similar rates



#### Depressive Symptoms, Suicidal Behaviors, & Self Harm




Depressive Symptoms in past year


- Mirroring statewide trends, female students reported more depressive symptoms than male student (26% vs 17%)
- **10% of PMS students** have considered suicide in the past year compared to 7% in 2019.
- 22% of PMS students have intentionally injured themselves without wanting to die in the past year compared to 16% in 2019.



# Priorities of PMS

The middle school leadership team have priortized social-emotional skills (SEL), mental health and bullying as student risk factors to be addressed over the coming year(s).
