



Classroom/Community Presentation

Milton's Billion Backyard Bee Project is a volunteer, non-profit organization (EIN #82-4234341) dedicated to promoting beekeeping and educating the community about the vital role of honeybees in our environment. Sebastian Wright created the project when he was 9 years old. He and his family tend to fifteen (give or take a few) backyard and community hives in Milton, MA. Sebastian is now in 9th grade and will attend Milton High School in September 2018.

Thank you inviting us to your school/community event. If you have requested that we bring a frame of honeybees in an observation hive, here is some information and a few facts to review before we arrive.

The use of observation bee hives continues to interest schools and communities. It is both educational and entertaining. Before we arrive, please verify that there are no liability issues with having honeybees at your site. You may want to notify participants that we are visiting. This is both a safety precaution and an opportunity to stimulate conversation at home about the importance of pollinators and healthy habitats. We love when children are teachers!

Our temporary observation bee hive holds one frame of honeybees and easily transportable. The frame of bees is housed only briefly and returned to its managed backyard hive when the event is over. We use it for demonstrations, class presentations, community events or you'll often see our honeybees at the Milton Farmers' Market during the harvest season. At your event, we like to place the hive in the center of a small table or an activity rug, so participants can view the honeybees easily and safely, share their comments, and ask questions. We request that participants refrain from tapping on the glass as honeybees have super sensitive senses! We enjoy answering questions before, during and after our visit!
