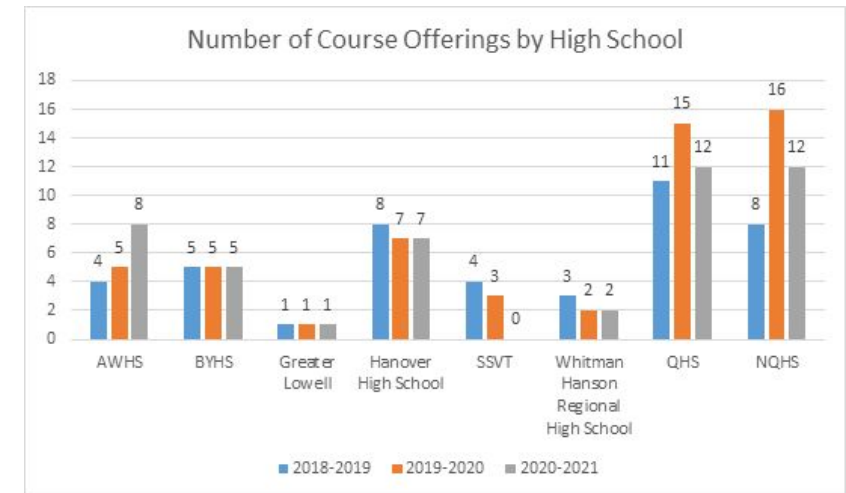
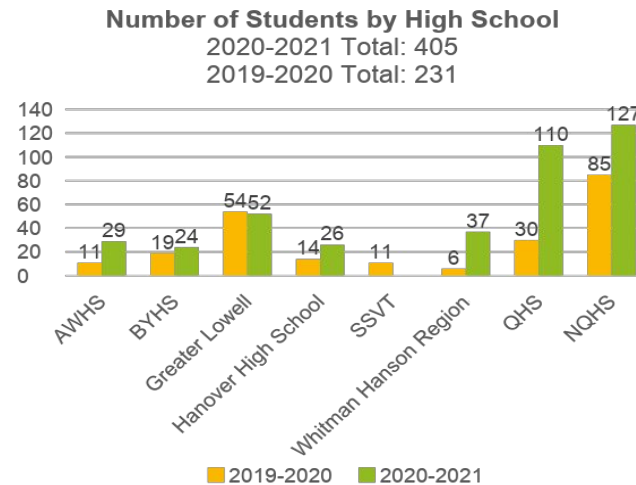
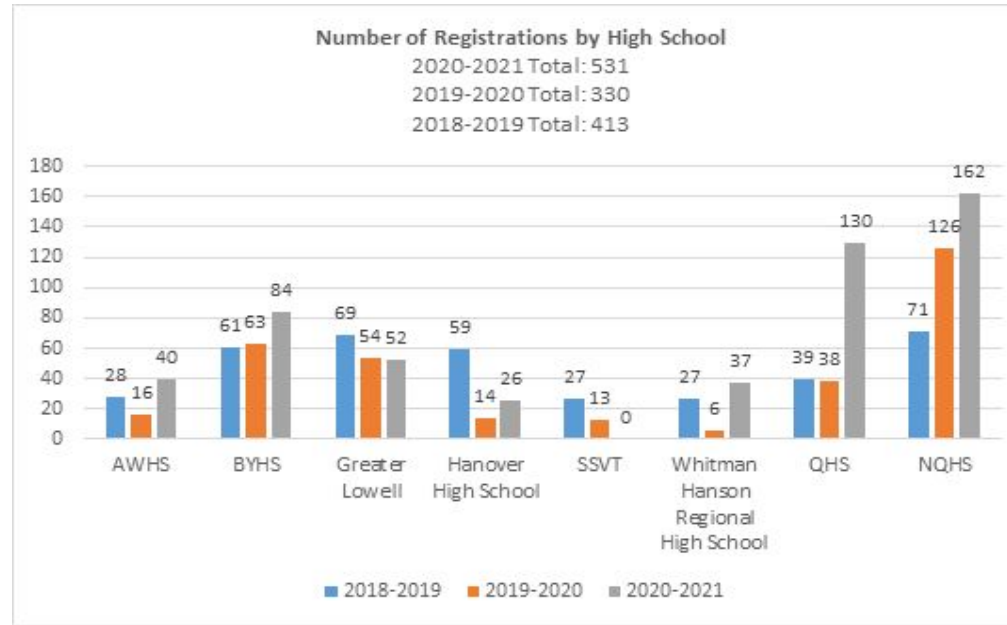
Quincy College Dual Enrollment Program Comparison

- Bunker Hill Dual Enrollment tuition \$660 for a 3-credit course.

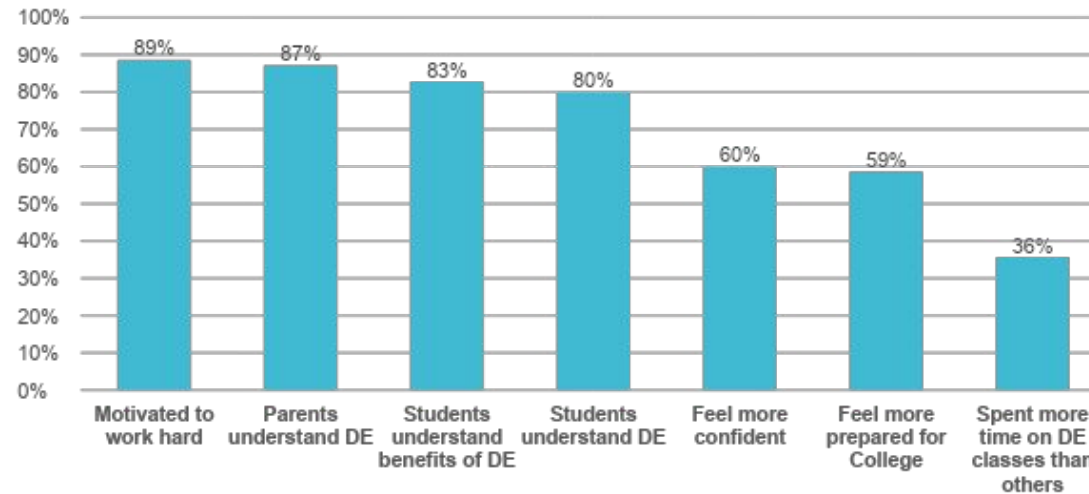
