Role: to serve as a point of contact and liaison between parents, teachers and school administrators for student-specific issues; to serve as the "face" of SEPAC in the building; and to help collaborate between the parents, teachers and administration of the school, and between the school and other schools, on issues of relevance to special needs students and their families.

Responsibilities:

- Ongoing communication with the school principal. These could consist of general "check in" emails, emails to the principal regarding specific concerns raised by a parent, student or teacher (if appropriate), or general concerns relating to the district's special needs programming and procedures, emails regarding upcoming SEPAC events or meetings, or any combination of
- Meet at least once during the year (preferably at the beginning of the year) with the team chair for the school.
- Become familiar with the types of special needs programs that are available at the school.
- Review other school-specific groups (PTO, site committee, diversity committee, etc.) and ensure that the rep is added to all such mailing lists. In addition, if possible, attend 1-2 meetings of each group per year to build contacts and relationships.
- Attend all SEPAC board meetings.

Estimated time commitment: 3-5 hours per month (including attending meetings, principal emails, and parent communications)

This year, the ESY program will be run by Mr. Mark Harrison. Mark reports some key infomration to keep in mind while you plan:

The Milton Public Schools will be offering Extended School Year services this summer beginning on July 6, 2021. All programs will once again be housed at the Collicot and Cunningham elementary schools. The program will run for six weeks, with a scheduled end date of August 13, 2021. It is anticipated that registration information for Extended School Year services will be sent to families in early May. Plans for how instruction will be delivered will also be communicated at this time. Any questions regarding your student's eligibility for Extended School Year services may be directed to your Team Chairperson. Our staff looks forward to another great summer of instruction.
