Cohort D students (remote) will attend school every day virtually and will receive class schedules from remote teachers the week of September 8.

Arrival and Dismissal Routines: For those families who are planning to drive their child(ren) to school, our arrival and dismissal routines have changed. Please be on the lookout for a specific email with maps, visuals, and video tutorials about how to drop off and pick up your child. If students are in fourth or fifth grade, they have the opportunity to be independent walkers/bikers. Please complete <u>this form</u> if you would like to grant your child permission to independently walk/bike home from school and please also indicate this on the Permanent Pick Up Form.

Absence Verification: As we do each year, we ask that you notify us if your child is going to be absent or arriving late to school. Please call the school at 617-696-4288 to report your child's absence and enter extension 2. Please make every effort to inform the school through this procedure whenever your child is out of school.

Staffing:

In **Kindergarten**, we have three In-Person Hybrid teachers: Carolyn Brandi, Stacia Kates, and Kate Elovich. Our Remote Kindergarten Teacher is Fiona Delaney. Our Mary McCarthy, quintessential First Grade teacher, has retired from the Milton Public Schools. We wish her the best in her retirement and thank her for her unbelievable dedication to countless Glover Kids. Both professionally and personally, I will miss Mary more than words can express but am glad that she has this time in retirement to spend with her two beautiful children and her husband. Our In-Person Hybrid French/English teachers are Monsieur Hoff and Mrs. Kempf. Our Remote Fourth Grade English teacher is Joan Dow and our Remote Fourth Grade French teacher is Madame Muhsin.

In **Fifth Grade**, our In-Person Hybrid English teachers are Melissa Craven, Katelyn Good, Alyssa Mazzotta, and Kara Gardiner/Kelly Ryan (co-taught). Fifth Grade French will happen remotely and will be taught by Monsieur Coben. Our Remote Fifth Grade English teacher is Joan Dow.

Our STEP Team has grown and welcomes Samantha Bennett as the STEP Special Educator taking the place of Morgan Hodlin who has accepted a position as a BCBA in another district. Samantha is excited to join Shannon Power, BCBA, in the STEP program. Amanda Brink will be joining Anne Ware as a Special Education Learning Center teacher.

A few of our Glover teachers have chosen to take a year's leave of absence: Liz Cardiasmenos, Lea Franklin, and Sara Murphy. In addition, we congratulate Shauna O'Leary who has accepted a Remote Reading Specialist position at Collicot.

From Nurse LeBlanc:

At Glover School, we are striving to maintain a **healthy environment** for all students and staff. We understand this can be difficult, but we are confident that we can be successful if we continue to work together. All **students who require medication** during school hours must have written documentation completed by MD. Please call the school nurse to arrange drop-off of medication, as children are not allowed to transport medication of ANY kind. This includes inhalers and Epi-Pens.

Masks - All students are required to wear masks at all times. Families are asked to provide masks from home but we will have extra masks if a child's mask becomes soiled or is misplaced. Please label masks if possible and send your child with an extra mask in a labeled baggie in the event of soiling.

Handwashing and Hand Sanitizing - Please help us remind children to wash their hands as often as possible, but particularly before eating and after using the bathroom and before and after touching their mask. Hand sanitizer will be available throughout the school when hand-washing is not possible.

Lastly, the state is requiring the FLU vaccine for all children in school in Massachusetts. This is in addition to the state mandated vaccines required for Kindergarten entry. The deadline for flu vaccine administration is 12/31/20, so please send documentation to the nurse's office ASAP. Thank you for your help. If we all do our part, we can look forward to a safe & healthy school year!

Chromebook Distribution:

As you read in AJ Melanson's recent email, we are asking that all Chromebooks that were borrowed from MPS last spring be returned immediately to Milton High School between the hours of 7am-3pm. We are hoping to identify those students most in need of a Chromebook so we can distribute the Chromebooks we have on hand accordingly- until our shipment arrives. If your family does not have a device at all that your student(s) can use for remote learning days (in the Hybrid Model or Full Remote Model) to start the school year, please complete this <u>Chromebook Need Declaration Form</u>. We want to make sure that all students will have access to some device to begin the school year. Once the shipment of Chromebooks arrives, we will distribute them to every student. However, we are trying to prioritize existing devices for students who have absolutely no access at the moment. More information regarding the pick-up of devices, MPS Chromebook Loan Agreement, Chromebook Use & Care Manual, optional insurance coverage will be communicated next week.

Fourth and Fifth Grade Diverse Reads Book Club:

We will be running the Glover/Tucker Diverse Reads Book Club again this year, and hope your student will want to join us. We may not be able to meet in person this year at our individual schools, but we will be setting up virtual meetings with all of the authors we will read, and we will have fun. We were able to go virtual seamlessly this past spring (and had a great, lively Zoom meeting with Kwame Mbalia!)

With more to come! The expectation is that students will have read or have listened to all or most of the book before we Skype with the author.
