## How we got here....

With the implementation of much new curriculum over the last 4 years, there was a clear need (recognized by teachers, administrators and parents) to revamp the report card to better reflect what our students know and are able to do.

SY' 2014-15 ended with the creation of a report card committee who began the process of reviewing a number of standards based report card models and providing feedback around priorities.

SY' 2015-16 allowed for further work with the RC committee and the drafting of the new cards.

SY' 2015-16 Kindergarten across the district pilots standards based report card.

SY' 2015-Present Teachers Begin benchmarking process to ensure consistency across the district.

### What Are the Major Changes?

#### **Old Report Cards**

- Handwritten
- Four Quarters
- Reporting Subject Proficiency
- Gr 4-5 Combine effort and proficiency in one % score

#### **New Report Cards**

- Computer-based
- Three Trimesters
- Reporting Proficiency by Standard
- Gr 4-5 Separate reporting of effort and academic proficiency through a scaled continuum

Traditional gradebook averages HW, tests, quizzes and often participation.






Figure 1. Comparing Traditional and Standards-Based Grade Books
