As a district, we have worked hard to promote equity and inclusion in our community. Our goal is to change how we all look at kids with Tourette Syndrome and all other neurological disorders.

Many still believe that Tourette is a very rare disorder; however, the latest studies from the CDC indicate that one in 120 children have Tourette or a tic disorder. This workshop will discuss the criteria for diagnosis of Tourette Syndrome and will include an in depth description of all the symptomology. Tourette is now commonly referred to as a "spectrum disorder". This workshop will also deal with the most common neurological disorders associated with Tourette, in particular, Obsessive Compulsive Disorder, Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder, Learning disabilities, Sensory Processing Disorder, Auditory Processing and Dysgraphia and the impact of all of these disorders on social emotional well-being, school performance and behavior. Ms. Conners will include specific strategies and techniques for working with children with Tourette and its associated disorders in a variety of settings. Since Tourette is often misunderstood as a behavior problem, it will also introduce participants to a Functional Behavioral Assessment designed for children with neurological disorders
