- Her 6 year old son is struggling more and more each day
- Technology is frustrating for younger children
- All levels are struggling
- Need to ask for a long term plan and understand Milton has an over enrollment issue

Kristen Kociol- 17 Standish Road

- 2 children in the MPS
- Is a nurse and has been working since the spring when others stayed home
- Need to listen to the experts
- No need to shut down a whole school for a positive and close contact cases if we are following the 6ft apart guideline
- Daughter is just sitting in an auditorium with substitutes

- We can do better than this
- Have lived with the fear of losing a child and would not jeopardize her child by sending her to school
- Experts say it is safe.
- Our children deserve better

Regina Murphy - 35 Alvin Avenue

- 2 daughters in the MPS
- Thanked School Committee and Administration for all the hard work and planning with the return to school
- Understand these are difficult times
- Here to advocate for the younger needs for our elementary school, especially kindergarten

- Thankful and honored to have this position
- Excited and looking forward to the challenge in working with the MPS
 - Introduction of Somaly Prak-Martins, newly appointed Senior Director of Educational Equity (Assistant Superintendent Spaulding read Somaly Prak-Martins resume to the community)

Somaly Prak-Martins replied:

- Thanked everyone for the warm welcome and kind words
- Thanked the parents for speaking and listening to their passion to what is happening
- Import that we stay connected and work as a team
- Very excited
- Introduction of Amy Dexter, newly appointed Assistant Superintendent for Business (Assistant Superintendent Spaulding read Amy Dexter's resume to the community)

Amy Dexter replied:

- Thanked everyone for the opportunity
- Looking forward to joining the team
- 10 years with the town and has worked with the administration
- 4 children have gone through the Milton Public Schools
- Understand the challenges that parents are facing with their children

- 4. COVID-19 Updates
 - Wanted to be clear that there is no switching of the plans, all plans were presented in the summer and voted on in the summer
 - All plans were emailed in the summer
 - All plans were submitted to DESE
 - Conferences are coming up
 - Asking for patience with the return
 - Sent out surveys all summer
 - All have worked all summer to plan
 - Opened September 16th, and now on our 43rd day of school
 - Still learning how to adapt and pivot in a moment's notice
 - There are space issues with building capacity
 - Plan in place
 - Adding filters into more classrooms
 - We have a plan and you may not agree with the plan and timeline but we are meeting
 - Have been clear with parents that it may not just be students it may be challenges with staff supervising classrooms
 - MHS classes had a number of positive cases in a short period of time which caused the closure of the High School
 - Positive cases in Milton are rising
 - Direct guidance given to community, but when it came to schools there was very little guidance
 - Very little availability of substitute teachers, we only hire qualified substitute teachers that the students deserve
 - Pleased to be in the trenches with the faculty and staff of the Milton Public Schools
 - Agree we need to work together
 - Hear the parents and value interpersonal relationships
 - Limited space even before the pandemic
 - Milton rises to the occasion
 - Communicating with PTO community
 - We are checking in with families and looking for feedback, it is a collected effort
 - Need transportation
 - Nurses and Principals are working nights and weekends
 - Not complaining, just asking for understanding
 - Modifying and looking at plans
 - Continue to move in the Hybrid Model
 - Need to consider health and safety of students, faculty and staff

- Let's work together, if there are issues please come to us
- We need to be role models for our students
- Committed to students and education
- Challenging times for everyone
- Friday, November 20th Covid testing will be provided in our Field House to the Milton Community (10am-2pm)

- a. FY22 Budget
 - 2- 2.3 million roll over
 - last year was 2 million
 - out of district placement is up this year
 - waiting for Administration to make decisions of the priorities needed

Regine Jean Charles - 70 Sumner Street

- 2 Pierce and 2 Tucker Students
- Welcomed and congratulated Somaly, excited to work with her and meeting her in person

Stevie Coldwell - Harold Street

- New to Milton
- Appreciate the conservative approach from the schools and the School Committee during this pandemic
- Milton was Hybrid before other communities even considered the model
- Happy with the option to choose between Hybrid/Remote models, won't be able to please everyone but this gave the community the option to chose
- Care and thought went into the plan with the return to school
- Was able to switch models and appreciate that option
- Support with plan and appreciate the hard work to keep the community safe

Elissa Perkins - 118 Wolcott Road

- Infectious Disease Specialist
- MPS Policies in place not grounded in science
- Need to make better decisions based on positive cases
- Important to look at the close cases
- Since there are 6ft apart policies in place in the classes, shutting down the entire school should not be an option

Jen Shea - 53 Wood Street

- Part of the group of parents that support return to school safely
- Over 600 members and have a petition over 500 signatures
- Commend the effort of the Administrators and teachers for creating a nurturing environment for our children, but our children need more time in school
- Many emails have been sent to the School Committee and Administration, Milton Public Schools are not following CDC guidelines
- Causing students to quarantine and shutting down schools by creating the terms close contact of a close contact (which is a term created by MPS)
- Everyone has different views than MPS, doctors and Board of Health disagree with quarantining a class due to a parent of a close contact
- Can do a better job with contact tracing, like seating charts
- Suicide is now an issue due to quarantine and shutting down of schools

Kerry Curley - Pleasant Street

- Assured Superintendent Jette that he is supported and loved by the community
- Admitted to being the sign bandit running around putting out the Return to School signs around town
- Don't feel that racial injustice needs to keep coming up and feels bad about it
- Racial injustice should not be part of the conversation, why are we bringing racial injustice up when we talk about returning to school
- Not a racist, I ask that you not bring race into the return to school decisions

Winston Daley - Eliot Street

- Wanted to address the racial injustice comment
- You cannot discuss the pandemic without talking about race and racial injustice
- Black and brown families have been mostly affected by Covid and this pandemic
- The idea of going back to school cannot be discussed without bringing up the impact of the black and brown community in Milton
- To the 600 parents in the group, do you have any black and brown parents, this does not affect you
- Look at the racial breakdown, look at numbers
- We all want our kids back at school but we are in a global pandemic, race is a factor

- Thanked all the parents for speaking and sharing their experiences
- Heartbreaking to know how worried parents are for their children
- So much uncertainty
- School Committee is listening
- Superintendent and Administrators are working hard
- Commend the district for working so hard
- Race is a part of everything, we need to do better in our community and our country
- Need to make a equitable society
- Thanked Winston Daley for speaking and sharing his thoughts
- Feel for the parents and there really just are not any answers

- Wanted to echo Ms. Eberhardt's comments
- Can relate to how the parents are feeling
- Not only about the education but the socialization
- Even if changes are not happening now, we are listening and reading your emails
- Many of us are going through the same thing you are

Dr. Donahue

- What has been learned over the past 6 to 9 months is that if you think that gender and race are not issues, than you have a privilege point of view
- These issues that people have to deal with on a daily basis others do not
- Thanked all the parents for advocating for their children, very helpful to receive the critical and supportive feedback
- Three general criticism and feedback from parents
 - parents would like additional in school time for elementary and high need students
 - o look at our Policies with close contacts
 - look at our contact tracing

School Committee will continue to look at those issues

Chair Varela

- We are hearing the community
- School Committee will be looking to improve, but it will not happen before January as Superintendent Jette stated
- When and if the changes occur, it will be shared with the community
- Superintendent Jette has been communicating with families
- Contact tracing issue can hopefully be improved upon with communication
