- Another round of registrations, added 30 more students just today
- 4420 students in the Milton Public Schools

- List of schools
 - Collicot 594 students
 - Cunningham 614 students
 - o Glover 584 students
 - o Tucker 447 students
 - Pierce Middle School 990 students
 - o High School 1151 students
- Public acknowledgment, August is one of biggest month with students moving in and registering
- 350 kindergarten students
- Increase from last year

Chair Eberhardt

• Many districts are seeing a decline in enrollment, but Milton has an increase of students

Dr. Craghead

- Numbers of students is high
- Once again, MPS will run over the number that our schools are built for
- Every year over enrollment has been a problem

Ms. Ross Denny

- Earlier this year we talked about the extra space that was identify
- Do you anticipate we will use this space
- Will it gradually increase

Superintendent Jette

- Will be using the extra space that was identified
- Have made a Capital request
- Anticipated a higher number
- Hope we are in good shape for space for the next school year
- Milton Schools and community attracts a lot of people/families to move in

Ms. Rosmarin

 This conversation will continue into our School Building Report because we looked closely at the enrollment projections and how it affects our application to the School Building Authority • Sean O'Rourke our School Building Chair put together a graphic to tells the story well that people understand the situation we are in with projection of enrollment

Sean O'Rourke

- Have lived in Milton for 3 years
- Director of Electrical Engineer, WSP
- Board of Directors for Constructions Managers Association of New England
- Worked on a variety of projects over the past 17 years
- Milton enrollment graph jumped out, when he went to an information session for his daughter's Welcome to Kindergarten
- 2008 enrollment started spiking
- Are we going to build a new school and are we going to build it correctly?
- O Dove into the numbers and square footage of all the schools
- Pushing with MSBA to apply for a State of Interest
- Hit on two factors, both for overcrowding and our application was denied
- Resubmitting the Revised Statement of Interest
- Want to give you a revised Statement of Interest

Sean O'Rourke and Ms. Rosmarin - MSBA School Building Presentation

School Building Authority (MSBA)

- Seeking Select Board and School Committee votes to authorize submission of the SOI to the MSBA
- The SOI is the first step in the MSBA's school building construction funding pipeline
- No Town commitments at this time
- No guarantee of acceptance by MSBA
- Competitive This year 15 accepted out of 71 submissions

MSBA SOI Process

- Due June 25, 2021
- 2021 Statement Of Interest Filing Deadline
- Town Requirements: School Committee and Select Board Vote to approve submission (no financial commitment at this time)
- July 2021 December 2021/January 2022
- The MSBA SOI Due Diligence Process
- Review SOI submissions, and accompanying documents, for content and completeness
- Conduct Senior Study Visits
- Recommend SOIs for Invitation into Eligibility Period
- December 2021/January 2022
- MSBA Board of Directors votes to authorize Invitation to Eligibility Period

MSBA Eligibility Phase

- Up to 270 Days January through July-September 2022 Compliance certification
- SBC formation may need to add a few members
- Educational Profile
- Maintenance Practices
- Design Enrollment (enrollment projections)
- Community authorization and funding to proceed (only if invited by MSBA to enter Feasibility Study) Town Meeting May 2022
- Execute Feasibility Agreement with MSBA

Town of Milton – MSBA Statement of Interest

- Cunningham School represents the elementary schools, but responses based on all four schools
- Priority 2: Existing Severe Overcrowding
- Priority 4: Prevention of severe overcrowding expected to result from increased enrollment

Town of Milton – MSBA Statement of Interest

- Previous Submittal used as baseline with updates per 2021 facility modifications and enrollment
- Existing conditions
- Measures taken to mitigate the problem
- Impact of overcrowding on district's educational program Non-traditional spaces converted to classrooms

Existing Conditions

- Elementary enrollment growth since last school building project 1,873 students in 2008 2,258 students in 2021 Increase of 385 students or 21% increase
- Schools built for 14 strands currently 5 classes short of 17 strands K-5 Elementary Space Needs Study shortage of 26 classrooms in 10 years
- Already converted over 20 non-traditional spaces into classrooms with 5 more projected for next 5 years

Measures to Mitigate Overcrowding

- Elementary Space Needs Study by DRA short- and long- term options
- Formation of School Building Committee
- Conversion of non-traditional rooms to classrooms

- Growing class sizes
- Shared overcrowded offices
- Votes taken by School Committee and School Building Committee to build a new K-5 school

Impact of Overcrowding

- Expanded class sizes make teaching and learning more difficult Cafeterias strained and Libraries compromised
- Limited ability to develop programs to enable special needs students to attend school in Milton rather than COSTLY out-of-district placements
- Art and music compromised with traveling teachers
- Computer Labs eliminated
- Overcrowded playgrounds
- Rest rooms limited and overtaxed
- Crowded offices minimizes time available for testing and service delivery
- Teacher common planning time compromised with no space to meet

Expected Future Increased Enrollment

- NESDEC (New England School Development Council) projections are CONSERVATIVE
- NESDEC Enrollment projections based on 2020-21 school year COVID19 pandemic enrollment decrease
- Early returns of registrations for 2021-22 school year indicate a return to pre-pandemic enrollment
- Assumes level birth rate
- Does NOT include "student yield" of numerous residential construction projects
- EIGHT 40B projects for potential total of 601 new housing units PLUS Other Residential Construction Projects = 771 new housing units

Ms. Rosmarin

- Statement overview
- Required by MSBA to vote
- Looking to vote on the submission
- No commitment from the town at this point
- Hopefully this time we will have more luck
- Very competitive process
- 15 were accepted last year
- Milton made it through the first round

• But unfortunately we were cut

Ms. Rosmarin made a MOTION FOR VOTE BY MILTON SCHOOL COMMITTEE TO AUTHORIZE SUBMISSION OF 2021 STATEMENT OF INTEREST TO MASSACHUSETTS SCHOOL BUILDING AUTHORITY.

Resolved: Having convened in an open meeting on June 16, 2021, prior to the SOI submission closing date, the School Committee of Milton, in accordance with its charter, by-laws, and ordinances, has voted to authorize the Superintendent to submit to the Massachusetts School Building Authority the Statement of Interest Form dated June 25, 2021 for the Cunningham School located at 44 Edge Hill Road, Milton, MA, which describes and explains the following deficiencies and the priority category(s) for which an application may be submitted to the Massachusetts School Building Authority in the future:

- Priority 2 Elimination of existing severe overcrowding
- Priority 4 Prevention of severe overcrowding expected to result from increased enrollments.

The elementary enrollment in Milton Public Schools has grown by 21% (385 students) over the past thirteen years, since the last school building project was completed - from 1,873 students (in 2008) to 2,258 students (in 2021), far exceeding the capacity of Milton elementary school buildings; and hereby further specifically acknowledges that by submitting this Statement of Interest Form, the Massachusetts School Building Authority in no way guarantees the acceptance or the approval of an application, the awarding of a grant or any other funding commitment from the Massachusetts School Building Authority, or commits the Milton Public Schools to filing an application for funding with the Massachusetts School Building Authority.

Second: Ms. White Roll Call Vote: 6-0-0

Dr. Craghead

- Thank you both for the thorough presentation
- Enrollment is going to go up not down
- Great job going through what was lost
 - Cafe, library, art rooms, music rooms, computer labs, etc.
- Rooms have been taken away from our students
- We need this new building, historically our enrollment numbers go up

Ms. White

Clarified, 25 years ago, did see that our enrollment was going to go up

- Schools would not allowed to build to projections only to the enrollment
- Can't build beyond the enrollment
- State of the buildings across the commonwealth, priority one buildings are too competitive for Milton
- Competing against a lot of schools that schools buildings that are older
- We have the enrollment crisis, we may have to look at creative ways to build

Sean O'Rourke

- MSBA will do their own projections
- Small reimbursements rate 30-35%, number can go down
- Building can be over a long period of time 7-8 years

Superintendent Jette

- Reviewed the slide Existing Conditions
- 40b projects are not allowed to be counted yet until they are completed
- Not just the space issue
- Also increase class sizes issues
- Make the current space we have tighter

Ms. Ross Denny

- Agreed that the class size ratios are an issue along with the enrollment
- Changes how teachers can instruct
- Milton can do better
- We may need a parallel path, what are we going to do for schools

Sean O'Rourke

• Working on alternative plans

Ms. Rosmarin

- Concerned about the 8 40b projects in the works
- This will be more families registering for MPS during our enrollment crisis

Chair Eberhardt

 Community should be aware the enrollment crisis has always been a part of the conversation over the years
