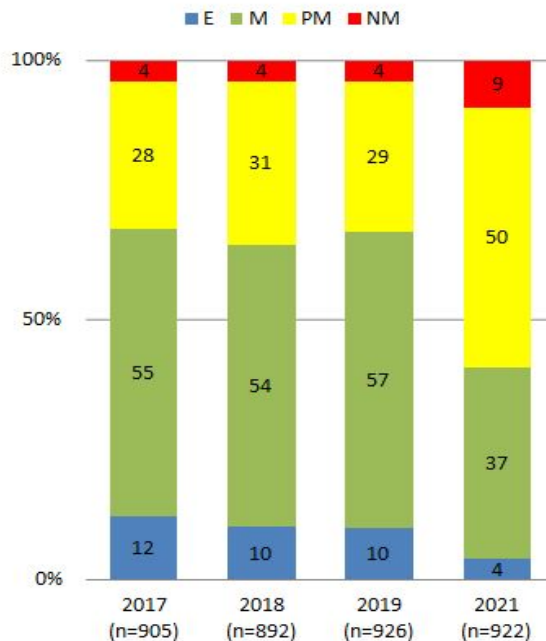

PMS MCAS Performance

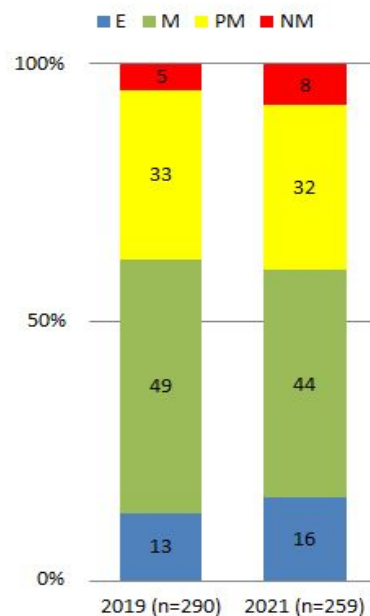
PMS ELA MCAS: % of Students at Each Performance Level

Level**

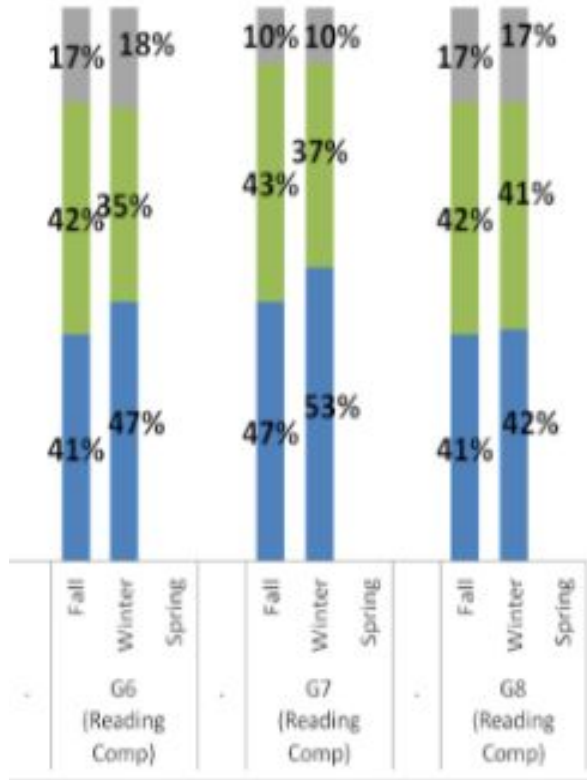


STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT: 2020-2021

 - Truncated curriculum pacing - half days, hybrid model

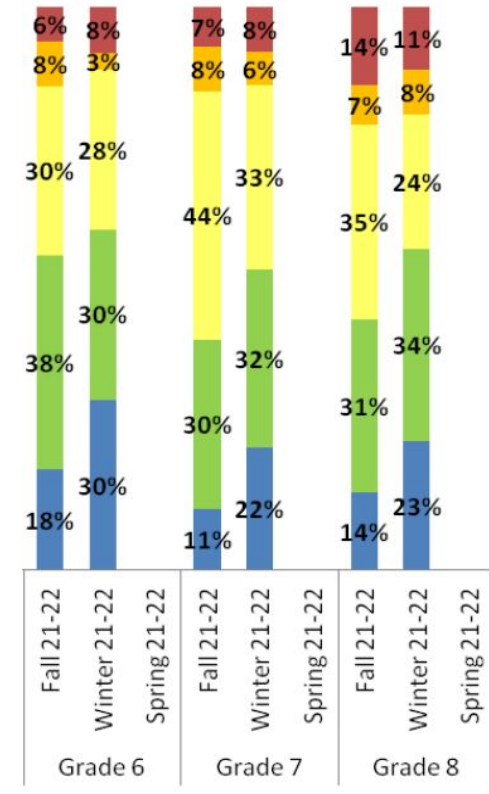
Lexia Rapid ELA Performance Data 21-22

■ 3+ grades below

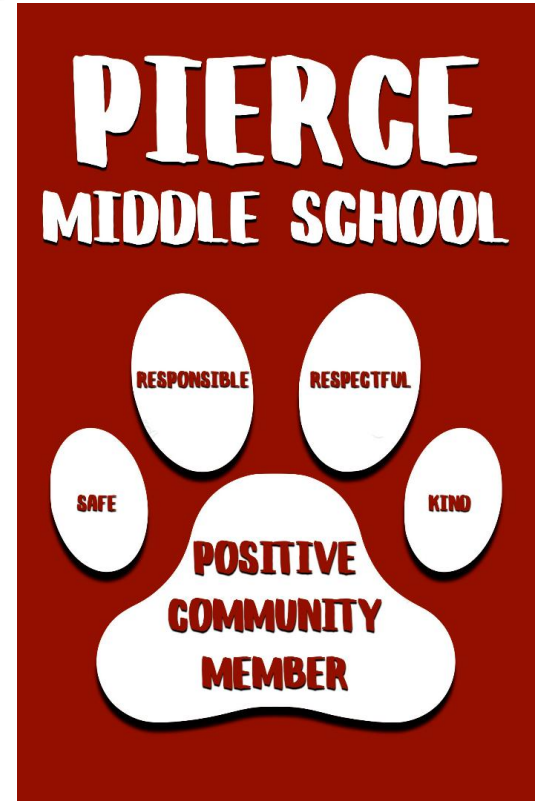


STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT: 2021-2022

UNDERPINNINGS OF SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT: DIVERSITY, EQUITY & INCLUSION

Focus Areas

1. Establish an incident reporting system that allows students, staff, family members, and community members to report incidents of bias, racism or discrimination.
2. Develop and implement a protocol for how leaders and teachers are required to respond to acts of racial aggression, racial slurs, hate speech, and hate actions to ensure a timely and effective response.

UNDERPINNINGS OF SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT: DIVERSITY, EQUITY & INCLUSION

Focus Areas (continued)

3. Identify and implement professional development experiences that equip educators to respond to hate, hate speech and bias.
4. Identify or create content/curriculum to engage students in educational experiences around recognizing and addressing explicit and implicit anti-bias and anti-racism, including how to interrupt microaggressions and bystander training.
