- 3. Superintendent's Update Acting Superintendent Janet Sheehan
 - a. School Updates
 - Transportation Update Assistant Superintendent Dexter
 - o 1460 students registered
 - o 647 high school and middle school, 813 are elementary students
 - Wait list of 82 students
 - o 27 students offered seats today, to be taken off the waitlist
 - o Those who lived furthest away are offered the seats first
 - Last year we brought on an 11th bus
 - Trying to solve the issue
 - Wild Cat Den flyers could help with the afternoon
 - First Student perhaps any availability of a higher capacity of a bus do they have larger buses?
 - High School Doors open at 7am could drop off earlier
 - First Students talking about getting a afternoon bus for High school and Middle school
 - Working hard on the transportation
 - Good News that Principals have been sharing
 - Strong focus on teaching and learning
 - Tucker Principal Catherine DesRoche
 - Students have a new schedule for technology support
 - Can access learning tools early on
 - Grade 3 students are writing fictional stories
 - Collicot Principal Holly Concannon
 - Excited to see new math program up and running
 - Students are participating in fall math and literacy assessment
 - New grade 5 schedule that integrates french and english students for lunch and science

- Glover Principal Karen McDavitt
 - Spoke for all of the elementary schools to report
 - Our students are benefiting from Math Interventionist support while using IReady data
 - Pre K and Kindergarten students are benefiting from early learning and literacy coach support using the Heggerty Reading Assessment data
 - IReady, Lexia and Heggerty Assessments are strengthening our capacity to use data to inform instruction and personalize learning
 - These positions have been made possible through the federal funding that has come to us over the past few years

 - Has a student who scored a 5 on her AP exam it was the highest score reported throughout the world

5. **Chair's Report -** Chair Rosmarin

a. <u>Status of Remote/Hybrid/In Person School Committee Meetings</u>

Chair Rosmarin - opened the discussion

- All have learned over the course of the pandemic, having remote participation has increased community access to the School Committee Meetings
- Easier for people to join
- Do lose the opportunity to build better relationships not meeting in person
- School Committee voted unanimously during the School Committee Retreat to have our meetings Hybrid
- Discussion across town about the Hybrid Option
 - Milton Access Studio is not equipped for a hybrid format
 - Shared additional information cost estimate would be \$40,000
 - Converted three rooms in town (2 rooms at Town Hall and 1 room at Counseling and Aging)

- The equipment needed to convert a room would not be available until next fall
- Hybrid meetings require 2 to 3 access staff
- Counseling and Aging set up is the largest room available
- Would need to pay the cost for custodial staff as well
- Room at town hall could accommodate but it is a small room for a crowd the other room is under renovation and used by the Warrant Committee
- High School Auditorium could be an option but the same issue of the equipment not being available until next fall
- Community Forum formats are also being explored
- This year is a transition year, people are starting to meet in person

Dr. Carroll

- Acknowledged that it is regrettable that we are in this situation as a town
- Need to plan to be proactive to provide the opportunity for the community to engage
- Perhaps can work with the town more for the resources
- How was it determined that those were the three rooms for the hybrid option
- Maybe open the discussions with town
- Have heard from a few members of the community wondering what the plan is about going back in person for the meetings
- Can we explore a way of trying different things, would rather not default to zoom
- Don't feel comfortable choosing one over the other
- Perhaps schedule in person meetings now and then

Member Varghese

- In the meeting yesterday with MPEG discussed the possibility of using one of the town rooms to have meeting
- Trying out the space
- Have also had members of the community reach out and ask when School Committee is going back in person
- Coordinate the space with town officials
- Want the community to join, to welcome them to share their thoughts and concerns
- Would like to explore different options

Dr. Miranda

- This is a town issue, not just a School Committee issue
- Applaud you for have these conversations with others
- Should be an equitable process
- Working with others on the solution of the use of the rooms
- Increase access as much as possible, hybrid would be the best option
- Don't hold back for organizing forums
- Maybe offer some in person meetings
- Need tolerance for the messiness of the new normal

Member White

- Ideal to offer the flexibility between zoom/in person and hybrid
- Been to meetings in the town conference room, and the space can be tight
- Watched the meeting online, the microphones don't work very well

Dr. Carroll

- Wanted to thank Dr. Miranda for her comments
- We are in this recreating the way we work
- Help all do the best that we can and keep working on a solution

Chair Rosmarin

- Have to be willing to try things out and reflect on things
- What works and what doesn't
- Keep trying until we find what works best for us
- Felt it was important to open up and discuss it again

- More conversations will take place over the policies

8. Facilities Advisory Committee Report - Member White

- Reached out to Principals to recruit new parent members
- 5 new parents are looking to get involved and participate
- Bill Ritchie gave a presentation during the Facilities Advisory Committee meeting
 - Discussed the needs of the district building a new school, temporary solutions or short term solutions around our overcrowding
 - Reviewed the option of the modular classrooms
 - Cost would be expensive (doubled in cost over the years)
 - o Proposed build modular at one site instead over 6 different areas
 - Looked at sites at Glover, Pierce and High School to evaluate which would be the best spot
 - The cost of the proposals would be over a million dollars, after the review decided that the site at the High School would be the best option.
 - 1.6 million for the site work
 - 8 classrooms
 - play ground
 - 5.3 million 6.7 million construction cost
 - Pierce Site
 - 4 classrooms
 - cost 3.5million 4.5 million plus the site work cost
 - downside is that the site is very narrow
 - and second site would be a distance away for students
 - Glover Site
 - 8 classrooms

- cost 5.3 million 6.7 million
- downside reconstruct the fire lane and increase traffic significantly
- Modular classrooms still may not happen until spring 2025, depending on the funding from the town
- Need to meet with principals, develop educational plans how do we use this space
- Do we use this space for Preschool?
- Still have to go back and discuss with educators on the space
- Modular classrooms have a long life space, and further down the road can be used for other school needs
- Who will be in charge of the modular space? Facilities, school committee?

Chair Rosmarin

- Looking for some legal advice for the charge of the School Building Committee
- Either way we will be coordinating and collaborating together

Dr. Carroll

- Good to hear the updates
- Feel like it is so important that we look at the time frame
- 2025 still seems far off
- This has been an ongoing issue
- Need to work together to help the town understand the issue

Chair Rosmarin

• Are the costs projected today's cost or 2025 cost?

Member White

- Replied, the proposed costs are today's costs
- If delayed, cost could increase
