### Dr. Miranda

- Thank you for the presentation
- Many areas of concern, glad we are looking at the data and knowing where to respond
- Students feel like they are being treated badly because of their race and sexual orientations. How do we make sure schools are a safe place and provide a sense of belonging?

### Principal Cahill

- Individually we are having those conversations with students as they come up
- We have different groups/clubs that meeting after school and students have the opportunity to express concerns to their advisors of the groups
- Leaderships teams are having conversations with the advisors regarding the issues
- Offering breakfast hours for students, giving the students the option to talk and express their concerns
- Leaderships teams are working with the students to empower them and identity the students who feel like they are being treated badly and having the conversations

- Using our reporting system
- Asking student to speak up, keep communications open at the high school
- Working with Claire Galloway-Jones Diversity and Inclusion Director
  - o Offering Restorative Justice Circle
  - o Young women's group
  - Young men's is not running currently due to the fact that an advisor is needed
- This is a work in progress

### Member Ross Denny

- Thanked the Milton Coalition for their work
- This is a community opportunity and challenge
  - We need to take responsibility to make sure that schools are safe for all students
  - Student of color or LGBQ+ may not feel safe
  - o Can not accept that others think that it's ok, it's not good enough
  - Look forward to seeing specific strategies to protect those kids that don't feel safe
- Alcohol use was reported to have gone down? Do you know why this has happened
- How do the kids know where to buy drugs?
- Any insight would be great

### Stormy Leung

- Alcohol reduction reported social access, not retail access
  - Trying to teach parents and students skills how to not put yourself in the presence of alcohol
- Youth are smart with social media can access substances so dangerous
- Meth creeping into our community very slowly

- a. <u>District Leadership Transition</u>
  - Exciting time for the Milton Public Schools
  - Have a tentative agreement with Dr. Peter Burrows to become the next Superintendent of Milton Public Schools
  - Since this is not on the agenda this evening, we are not able to take a vote tonight
  - We have scheduled a special meeting to ratify Dr. Burrows' contract on January 23, 2023 at 7am
  - Dr. Burrows will begin on July 1, 2023
    - Will plan to come to Milton for a number of days before July 1st to work on an entry plan
  - Having been working with Dr. Carroll and the central office team on the transition plan for when Superintendent Sheehan leaves on Friday, Feb 3, 2023
  - Plans are still being finalized
  - Happy to report that Assistant Superintendent Dr. Garth McKinney has agreed to serve as Interim Superintendent between February 6, 2023 Jul 1, 2023
  - Still working out the details
    - Will take a vote on Feb 1, 2023
  - Will be a brief transition, stability will be a priority
  - Important events have already been scheduled for the remainder of the school year
