Serene Hamsho

- Here on behalf of Milton Neighbors
- Representing over 300 residents in Milton
- Also here on behalf of my two daughters and an expectant mother
- Here to ask for official days off for Eid al-Fitr and Eid al-Adha on the school calendar
 - Following neighboring school districts (Cambridge and Acton)
- These two holidays are the most sacred ones to more than 2 billion Muslims around the world and the United States
- Hold the same sacredness as Easter, Yom Kippur and the same joy as Christmas
- These holidays are celebrated across our district but remain invisible
- They are mentioned on the school calendar, school principals and staff try to accommodate students but it is still a significant burden for our students/kids
- We wish to observe this day with our families and community while not missing school
- Imagine taking an MCAS exam on Christmas Day, it is exactly the same feeling
- Including Eid, we send a powerful message of inclusion and respect to our Milton students
- It acknowledges their faith and validates their culture identity which is the most important to me
- Makes the students feel valued and accepted in our educational system
- It is a valuable educational opportunity, it allows us to teach our students about the diversity of the world and the importance of cultural competence
- Promotes tolerance and empathy among students
- Understanding adding another holiday to the school calendar requires careful consideration
- We can look to other districts for guidance and best practices

- As a mother, having the day off is the best educational opportunity for our kids because the first question the kids will ask is "why is it a holiday"?
- Urge the School Committee to consider the inclusion of Eid as a school holiday
- We are coming to a crucial election year in 2024 where a Muslim name will be heard all over the news

- It was a change of tone and created a sense excitement to work for the Milton Public Schools
- Had a question about the communication piece
 - For families and the role for PowerSchool will that platform be playing a role in the communications to the families or is that a separate system?

Dr. Burrows

- Replied it will, PowerSchool enables us to give parents a much deeper view into what is happening

 - Allows an employees to login to see how much time they have (sick, personal and vacation)
- 5. Chair's Report Dr. Carroll
 - a. <u>Superintendent Evaluation Process</u>

Dr. Carroll

- Continuing our conversations from the Summer Retreat
- Set up clearly planned out process
- Few updates
 - Formally deciding if we are moving forward with a Subcommittee structure
 - Member Varghese, Dr. Miranda and myself moved ahead to have a conversation with Dr. Burrows to bring us one step further in the planning
 - Identifying the two documents that were included in our folder, lengthy documents provided by DESE
 - Documents we will use as we guide our process
 - Create a timeline
 - Discussed with Dr. Burrows a timeline that seems to make sense recognizing that as a School Committee we should be having three Open Meetings to discuss the Superintendent Evaluations throughout the year
 - First Open Meeting where we will approve the Superintendent Goals, propose that will be on September 20th (next meeting)
 - Discuss and vote on the Goals the Superintendent has put forward
 - Then a mid-year check in to assess progress towards the goals - propose that Open Meeting takes place on January 3, 2024
 - 3rd Open Meeting is proposed to be on March 20, 2024
 - Do those three dates work for all of us to be in attendance?
 - Discuss the first 6 pages of the overview that outlines DESE's process, section on page 5 that is discussing the role of the subcommittee of moving the evaluation forward
 - Member Varghese, Dr. Miranda and myself are willing to take a first step in the process
 - What are the pros and cons of the process?

- One pro would be three of us instead of 6 are able to find time, spend time with Dr. Burrows
- Then the Subcommittee would submit a full report back to the School Committee

Member Qiu

• Will not be able to make the March 20th meeting

Member Ross Denny

- Believe this will be a more effective and robust process
- Prior years when the entire committee worked in isolation and then meeting, we didn't have the opportunity to have the in depth discussions and feedback
- Want to ensure that everyone's voice is incorporated, want everyone to have the opportunity to share feedback

Dr. Carroll

- Your point is very well taken
- All 6 members are all ultimately completing the rubric tools which are given to us to participate in the evaluation process

Member Loring

- Generally agree with the premise of trying to complete the evaluation before the School Committee turns it over
- We did not have that when I just joined
- The evaluation of the Superintendent at large seems like the most important thing the School Committee does everyone is still providing feedback about the Superintendent
 - Is this Subcommittee Proposal, is the Superintendent still coming and presenting about the artifacts to the whole committee?
 - What does the mid-year and the following meeting of the evaluation look like?

Dr. Carroll

- My understanding is that the Subcommittee would be the group that would hammer that out
- Description of who is doing what
- Subcommittee would be the vehicle for receiving and processing the input from members of the Committee that are not on the subcommittee
- Subcommittee will submit a full report to the School Committee during an open meeting
- Would be an opportunity to each time there was a meeting to get input from the other School Committee members
- Want to be clear I did not recall being a part in the evaluation process due to the various transitions

Dr. Burrows

- Page 5 articulates the MASC recommendations
 - Options are to give the Subcommittee some of the work to do, or giving the School Committee the entire process

Member Ross Denny

- Trying to correct a experience we have never had
- That is our disadvantage
- My hope is that through this Subcommittee process there will be a common set of expectations so that when we are reading the rubric we are all thinking about it the same way
- Hope that each year we get better with the process
- We are learning to define our work

Dr. Carroll

- Want to create substantial and transparent systems for the work we are doing as a School Committee
- Is it possible to identify the three members who want to serve on the Subcommittee?
- Who wants to serve on the Subcommittee?

Dr. Miranda

- Two decisions to be made
 - The agreement of forming the Subcommittee?
 - And who will be on the Subcommittee?

Dr. Carroll made a motion to form a Subcommittee of the School Committee to work on the Superintendent evaluation process.

- I have had evaluations that I felt like I received a bunch of individual evaluations which is less meaningful
