




Collicot Mission










2022 Spring I-Ready Data



2023 Fall I-Ready Data








Fall 2023 K-5 Composite DIBELS Data















Grade 5 Model Pilot

- All students placed in homeroom based on pathway
- Students from English Innovation and French Immersion pathways mixed for science class
- 0.3 FTE French teacher now teaches 2 sections of French and is moved to 0.6 FTE
- Students eat lunch daily with students from science class.
- Many events for Grade 5 students beyond the school day





Next Steps

*Using daily attendance and other data from PowerSchool, we will work to recognize good attendance and work to improve poor student attendance. We will employ data to Identify individuals and groups of students who are missing 10% of their days.

We will work to provide additional supports for chronically absent students by engaging students and families, providing personalized outreach and working to remove barriers.

Attendance reports will be pulled every Monday before the Behavioral Health Team meets so this can be part of the support planning.

*Using Vector Solutions, DESE focus indicators, classroom look-fors, and insights collected from classroom visits, we will establish an efficient and effective system for providing educators with feedback. This feedback will streamline supervision and evaluation, improve the quality of feedback provided to educators, and ensure the presence of school leaders in classrooms. Progress toward meeting this goal will be measured by documented adherence to evaluation timelines, a log of classroom visits, and samples of feedback provided to educators from observations, formative assessments/evaluations, and summative evaluations.


