Milton High School Program of Studies - Principal Cahill

2024-2025 Program of Studies was shared at the last School Committee Meeting.

Dr. Burrows

• Looking at the Math trajectory, can you describe from 9th to 12th grade how students can select in and out of different math courses?

Principal Cahill

- Overall the chart shared is the normal trajectory for students
- There are always diversions to the pathway but those are conversations students would have with Mr. Selig and Math Teachers
 - Depending on the students background in math

Member Loring

• In the pathway - are students able to take both AP Calculus and AP Stats?

Principal Cahill

- Yes, students are able to take both
- 4 years of Math is a requirement
 - For some students, AP Stats can be an elective

Member Loring

- On the previous chart, 9th graders had taken course I or coure II (due to placement test)
 - Is that still the case with the proposal?

Principal Cahill

- Mr. Selig works with the 8th grade math teachers to address any appropriate math placements for students
 - Algebra and Geometry Statistics
- Looking at the exposure the students have prior to going into course II to be sure they have the foundation to be successful

Member Qiu

- Looking at the graduation requirements
 - Language requirement is not listed but is a part of our curriculum
 - Are we thinking about adding a language requirement or not?

Principal Cahill

- Yes, absolutely looking at the big picture and on the master plan
 - At least add 2 years of a language for a gradation requirement
- Will stress to families that although we do not have a language requirement, the state of Massachusetts for state colleges requires at least 2 years of a foreign language at the high school level
- 85% 90% meet that language requirement because they continue on the track
- Most of our students exceed the requirement with 3 to 4 years of a foreign language
- Definitely would like to explore more

Member Qiu

• The World Language department only offers three European languages, will there be a conversation about offering languages other than French, Spanish and Latin?

Principal Cahill

- We have had those conversations over the years
- Comes down to staffing, funding, availability and interest
- We have a more global population so should look into expanding our languages

- 65 Students mentioned that have been placed out of district
 - Hoping the space limits do not prevent the planning of bringing the students back into the schools
 - Look to frame differently
 - If space is not the issue, how do you plan to bring students back?

Danielle Wetmore

- Looking at our students with Reading disabilities and on IEP's
 - Least restrictive environment research shows that students make more progress when included
- Looking at the Student Programs and looking at where students are and the students needing that pull out support
 - Add class support
 - Take space out of the conversation
 - \circ $\;$ Will start to see out of district decreasing over the next couple of years

Member Ross Denny

- Congratulations on being so proactive
- Engaging with the SEPAC and being thoughtful about a task force
- Has there been any discussion with the task force on how to create a community for students as they age and things become more challenging socially?
- And that environments are created for students to be together with other students to build healthy and successful relationships?

Danielle Wetmore

- This has not been specially talked about with the task for but has been discussed with SEPAC
 - Have discussed creating that community for students to feel that sense of belonging
 - Work in progress

- Have had those difficult conversations that all of our students have the right to participate
- Destigmatizing and talking about our students are all of our students
- How to we find ways to engage all of our students and give all students access as appropriate
- This includes our out of district students
 - How do you give them access to activities taking place?
 - Can we adjust our times to support students?
 - Want all students to be part of the community, the goal is to have out of district students come back to the school community
 - Should be the top of the priority list

Member Ross Denny

- Maybe there could be ways for the community to be in partnership with the town
 - Work with the task force
 - Glad it has come up and being discussed

Danielle Wetmore

• Not having a sense of community for the out of district students who have been out of the school for so long brings a sense of urgency to have this on our radar

Dr. Carroll

- Thank you sharing the presentation and updates
- You are opening up meaningful opportunities for students to be included
- Thank you for being ahead of the curve and raising the bar

Danielle Wetmore

• Everyone is looking and striving for ways to help support students

Member Varghese

- Being on the task force has been awesome
 - Enjoy working with a room full of people who are full of passion and want to work together
 - Looking forward to our next task force meeting

a. <u>Finance Subcommittee Report</u>

FY25 Budget Development

Member Ross Denny

• Met yesterday and the entire committee was present

- Received a brief overview from Dr. Burrows and Dr. Pavlicek about the status of the budget and the feedback they have received from the Select Board
- Having our Budget Forum Hearing Meeting next Wednesday, March 6, 2024
- As a committee, we agreed that is was appropriate to go beyond the Roll Over Budget and have an honest discussion about the Needs Based Budget
 - Took on the responsibility to
 - Ensure the opportunity to to speak with the Town Administrator about our request for a Needs Based Budget
 - Talk to our community
 - Pursue an override
- Optimistic that if there are any opportunities to fund some of the positions listed in the Needs Based Budget that we will purse that with the town
- It was our decision, voted on unanimously, that we would going to make the formal request that the Need Based Budget be supported by the Select Board
- Appreciate the advocacy and leadership of all of you

Dr. Carroll

- Just one note from the meeting yesterday
 - We will be posting on the MPS website Under School Committee
 - Providing helpful overview
 - School Budget Hearing will be March 6th at 6:45pm before the School Committee Meeting

Member Ross Denny

- We walked through our request of the Select Board
- We are out performing districts but under spending
 - We are asking staff to do a disproportionate amount of work, less efficiently because we are understaffed

Member Varghese

• Do we have an opportunity to make a request for an override in the spring?

Member Ross Denny

- We can advocate for our budget with the Select Board and ultimately they make the decision for the override
- The budget is not final, not sure there is an overall support of an override at this time
- As long as the vote is not final, we have opportunity to discuss things further

Member Varghese

• When would that be, would that be next week?

Dr. Carroll

- After attending the Select Board meeting last night, fair to say the discussion maybe not favorable for an override this year
- Recognizing there are unmet needs across the town
- Select Board were discussing the context of starting the override conversation for next year
- Our recommendation to the town is the Needs Based Budget

Member Ross Denny

• Would recommend people attend meetings and share their feelings

Member Varghese

- Looking at the list of needs and don't see how any of this can be put off for another year
- We should do what we can to advocate for the students
- Hope their is an opportunity to make a case and have them reconsider

Member Loring

- Feels like we need to reassess our budget timeline
 - How can we have these conversations sooner?
- Our students should not be punished because there are other priorities
- A year is long time to wait for a student
- Gone through the data of how poorly we fund our schools

Member Ross Denny

• The version of the Budget was prepared in December and it was delayed (not by our doing)

Member Loring

- Do appreciate how we have got to a Level Service Budget don't want to disregard that progress that has been made
- Disheartened how quickly the idea of trying to advocate for additional funding by the town was dismissed
- This is not a wish list, this is what do our kids need

Member Ross Denny

- We can do better, we have a number of strong elected officials and a strong community
- We can figure out, amazing what people can do when there is an incentive

Dr. Miranda

• We are at a pivotal moment as a district

- We have great leadership
- New members are coming with great aspirations and vision with skills to deliver
- If we can make a systemic change that is going to set us up for greater success, we should not be settling or comprising of what we can do
- We have a leader who wants to guide us and we need to equip the leadership
- Should be able to move forward in a way that will make us proud
- Encourage people to show up, email, call and be a part of the process

Dr. Burrows

- Funding public education is problematic
- As mentioned thinking around the strategy and the process we follow
 - We naturally convert to year to year thinking
 - We can't continue year by year where is the budget right now?
 - Need to be funding the vision hard to do but need to be bringing that conversation to town and to make the impact

Member Ross Denny

- Would like to give Town Administrator Nick Milano credit, he did share a three year funding plan in January when we were talking about an override
- It was the better plan because it reflected what we knew to date need to be funded
- It was a responsible budget and would not mind revisiting the plan
- Encouraged the community to review the plan

Member Varghese

- Agreed with Member Ross Denny
- Remembered the presentation having a lot of detail
- The unknown talks yearly of the override
 - Should discuss what is the plan, what are we trying to work towards?
 - Look at the results associated with the plan

Dr. Pavlicek

- If you look at the town's budget
 - 3 of the places you see the most positive effect are the places we actually did long range planning

• Good work happens when we make the investments
