
Program

- National Geographic's Reach for Reading: Comprehensive K-5 common core reading program. Implemented in 2016 after a full curricular review
- Heggerty: Phonemic Awareness lessons implemented in all Preschool and Kindergarten classrooms
- UFLI Foundations: a systematic and explicit phonics program being used in Tier 2 small group reading intervention and being piloted at one elementary school

Pedagogy

- Thematic, standards-based units of study
- Grade level material for all students with small group targeting of skills needing reinforcement
- Explicit phonics instruction with a particular focus in grades K-2
- Data-driven instruction and intervention DIBELS, Boost Reading, Unit Assessments, etc.


