- Dr. Burrows
 - Discussed the implementation of the Priority Report in the last meeting
 - Priority Report is going out to the community this week and in the monthly update
 - Compiling all the data from the in service day with all staff on March 5th
 - Team effort of facilitating the data
 - Multi-year plan going forward
 - Help with the focus on what needs to be done
 - Simplified vision
 - Policy Team have been doing great work
 - This includes Residency
 - Danielle Wetmore has been working with our registrar
 - Looking at other communities throughout the metro area to see what their policies look like and what changes we may want to make to our policies
 - In a future meeting we will share more information on the Residency Policy
 - Kindergarten Enrollment
 - 349 students enrolled
 - Uptick of about 25 students
 - Will need to add another class

- Asked where we are with the Pre K Program?
- Where are we with numbers and space?

Dr. Pavlicek

• We are working at looking at the spaces now in the schools

Member Loring

• Looking at the Kindergarten Classes of 349 students do we have a general sense of how many more will register from now until September?

Dr. Pavlicek

- We are already up 25 students from last year
- There will probably be a few more with registrations with families moving into town over the next few months
- Will have 16 kindergarten classes this year
 - a. <u>Student Opportunity Act Plan</u> Slides Shared

Dr. Burrows

- The Student Opportunity Act Plan is a requirement to come before the School Committee for approval
- Required DESE Plan
- SOA plans aligns with what we have been talking about with our staff MTSS Supports at all levels
- Monitor and evaluation progress make changes to the system
- MTSS discussions happened during the Professional Development Day on March 5th

Dr. Pavlicek

- As part of the Student Opportunity Act 3 years ago
 - Legislature put in the language that every district needs to have a Three Year SOA Plan
 - This is a rolling requirement
 - The plan format changed a little this year
 - Focused areas to choose from choose 1-3 Focus Areas in the Metrics
 - We chose 2 around MTSS
 - Needs to submitted by April 1, 2024

Dr. Carroll

• Appreciate the clarity of the presentation and we can stay focused on what has to be done

Member Varghese

• On Slide #11 it mentions hiring an additional Reading Interventionist in FY26?

Dr. Pavlicek

• This hire is hopefully in the needs based for FY25 but being optimistic

Member Loring

• Asked about the current curriculum - any updates/changes in the next year?

Cat DesRoche

- 2019 Ed Reports came out with Curriculum Reviews
- Partially meets their expectations
 - We implemented in 2016
 - Have other resources out there that can give us more streamlines
 - We have two strong buckets of need
 - K 3rd Grade Foundational Phonics
 - Grades 3-5 Writing Piece

Member Loring

- In your assessment can one curriculum fix all or you might try to use EL Instruction/Education for fiction/non-fiction, reading comprehension?
 - Different Curriculum for writing and for K-2?

Cat DesRoche

- Don't want to exclude any possibilities not haven met with teachers
- Through conversations with colleagues
 - It does get complicated when you bring in multiple resources when it comes to the foundation of the 6 components of the literacy block
 - Splitting them up is hard
 - \circ $\,$ It is an option but would take a lot of work on the front end of the school year $\,$

Member Loring

• A review and new implementation of a potential new ELA curriculum simultaneously with K-5/K-8 - would there be hope in FY26 rolling it out within a couple of grades, then a few grades the following year?

• What would a potential roll out plan be?

Cat DesRoche

- In 2016 the proposal was to do a K-2, then roll it up through the grades
- We were making a significant shift in resources
- It is a really big deal for a teacher to implement a curriculum
- Thinking through and leveraging the curriculum
 - How are we going to support the most people?
 - This is a real priority
 - Want to positively impact students

Dr. Burrows

- Historically move of this roll out has been done sporadically
- Has not been a coordinated centralized process district wide
- That is the change we are moving towards
 - Going in with resources
 - Build an assessment system
 - Work to do across subjects areas
 - This work will come out in the implementation plan
 - Want to provide the support
 - Looking at teaching practices and the assessment system that is tied across all subject areas
 - Will be looking to have a long term plan in place

Member Loring

• How are we preparing and providing the resources to help with the implementation?

Cat DesRoche

- Need to front load the professional development
- Helpful to have a timeline

Member Varghese

• With the collected data you have, what are you seeing?

Cat DesRoche

- Data over the years
 - When we switched from Unit of Study we saw an uptick in performance across all subgroups in particular our lower performing subgroups
 - Pedagogy gave us an edge with the structure and balance
 - Covid did impact the data in a negative way
 - We have subgroups we are not supporting and not moving along the achievement lines as much
 - Do think it is training and access to professional development
 - Need time to collaborate with teachers and talk about best practices
 - What we can access for resources and collaborate with each other
 - We have strong talent

- Sharing the practices in the priority report has helped
- How can we structure these conversations with teachers?
- Curriculum tools has helped us to shift in a more powerful way
- Need the balance between how the teachers feel about the needs of the students and support the understanding behind the resources

Member Varghese

• What was behind the reasons for adding the two Reading Specialist positions in the budget?

Cat DesRoche

- Tier II in a General Ed Model
 - 1st and 2nd Grade Reading Specialist in each elementary school
 - Depending on the data, we shift what their caseload looks like
 - In the definition of equity, we take everyone's data and see where the need is
 - Talk with teachers and look at the data and make sure the resources are allocated in all buildings
 - 3rd grade have 2 district Reading Specialists
 - Address the needs we see in the data
 - 4th-5th grade we do not have a formal Tier II
 - We have Tier II when it comes to classroom teachers
 - Work in small groups
 - No additional staff for that role
 - Pierce Middle School
 - Reading strategy class with a Reading Specialist
 - We have implemented the 3rd grade Reading Specialist district wide
 - Families and teachers are asking why students are not receiving help and 4th and 5th grade
 - Reading Specialist training is different from a classroom teachers although most elementary teachers are strong ELA teachers
 - Examining our students and where their needs are
 - Due to Covid there has been a foundational gap

Member Varghese

- Appreciate you are prioritizing this now
- We want to support you in any way we can with providing you with resources
- Want to be sure this is successful

Beverly Ross Denny joined the School Committee Meeting.

Dr. Miranda

- What gets in the way of fidelity?
- Fidelity requires dedicated professionals development and attention to the data
- Thinking about communication
 - How do we make sure this doesn't get to the forefront just once a year?

Dr. Burrows

- What you are articulating is really important for all the work we are doing as we move ahead
- Data points we are assessing how we are doing year to year with reading scores
- Communicating this work in ways that everyone can understand
- Staff is the starting point
- This is not just buying the curricula and assume the curriculum with teach
- This is having a highly articulated structure system that allows teachers to bring their creativity, passion and inspiration
- MTSS have supports in place
- Tier I setting in the classroom when a student needs additional support they move to Tier II for extra support and intervention then move back into Tier I
- Need to shift our outcomes
- Communicate and engaging the work

Cat DesRoche

- What we are talking about across district curriculum level in the content areas is with implementation report
 - How can we each continuously communicate updates to the community in a way that is accessible while evaluating the importance of the work
 - These conversations are happening and know the communication is needed

Dr. Carroll

- The alignment is obvious
- Thankful that Dr. Burrows had you come in for the presentation
- There have been questions from the community and this is valid information
- Hope people look at the recording and presentation
- Appreciate what is happening in Tier I and Tier II
- Timeline is important and appreciate the talk of front loading the professional development
- Your engagement outside of Milton is refreshing as well, looking at other districts and where they are successful
 - We can learn from other district and they can also learn from us
- Look forward to seeing the data and what teachers have shared with you
- Interested in understanding the relationship between the work you are describing and our French Immersion Program?
 - Understanding all students are accessing the phonemic awareness skills

Cat DesRoche

- Did share with the team last week
 - Zeina Hamada agreed this would be great for the French Immersion as well
 - Would be universal approach

Member Loring

• Is the Plan Curriculum Review just K-5? Cat DesRoche replied yes.

Dr. Burrows

- A lot of different ways to look at the curriculum adoptions
- Something that needs to be talked about as a team, what is our vision?
- Development happens at all different times

Member Loring

- K-5 piece
 - With building the new school (lower middle school) would give teachers cross collaboration being in the same building would be helpful
- What is the name of our Social Studies Curriculum?

Cat DesRoche replied Sovis.

Member Varghese

• How has the Middle School curriculum been going?

Cat DesRoche

- Teachers are implementing 3 to 5 units of study in each grade
- Over the last 3 years have selected novels to use in addition to
- Curriculum is Amplify ELA
- Highly rated on the reports
- Centered around grammatical units integrated both literary and informational text
- Typically higher than grade level text
