From the Glover Nurse:

Current Illnesses: The stomach bug and respiratory viruses & infections have been slowly on the rise at Glover School. There have also been a few cases of conjunctivitis and strep throat. Please remember to continue to follow the MPS policies regarding keeping children home for a full 24 hours without vomiting, diarrhea and/or fever before sending them back to school. People diagnosed with strep throat need to be on antibiotic for a full 24 hours before returning to school.

Lice: Fortunately, the presence of head lice has decreased!! Please continue to add head checks to your daily routine and report any cases of head lice to the school nurse. Please be diligent about checking your children especially after travel, vacation and sleepovers.

4th Grade Physicals: If you haven't done so already, please send a copy of your child's most recent physical exam into the nurse's office. This is a state mandate to keep the school health records up-to-date.

Screenings: Hearing, vision, BMI and postural screenings are on-going. If your child is already followed by a specialist and doesn't need school screening please email the school nurse: mleblanc@miltonps.org.
