There are many opportunities to practice your calming down strategies at school. You may have a strong feeling when you have to wait, or when you make a mistake, or when you have trouble finishing a task. These are perfect moments to practice using your stop signal, naming your feeling, and calming down. When staff and students at our school calm down our emotions, it helps us all learn." I share this language in the hopes that we can develop common language between school and home. From Nurse LeBlanc:

Flu: There have been confirmed cases of the influenza virus (also known as the flu) in various grade levels. Please keep your child home if they are experiencing any flu-like symptoms and contact you health care provider as soon as possible. It's not too late to get the flu vaccine. The CDC recommends a yearly flu vaccine as the first and most important step in protecting against flu viruses. Take everyday actions to stop the spread of germs. Wash your hands often with soap and water, cover your nose and mouth with a tissue or arm when you cough or sneeze. Disinfect frequently used household items. Please refer to the CDC.gov/flu website for more helpful information. **GI virus**: The number of cases of the stomach bug is increasing in all grades. Symptoms may include nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, stomach pain, headaches and/or fever. Please

keep your child home from school if they are experiencing any of these symptoms. People should be without symptoms for a full 24 hours before returning to work or school. Please reinforce proper hand hygiene especially after using the bathroom and especially before eating, preparing or handling food.
