In light of everything happening in our country, please know that your child's safety is paramount to us all. I feel that my most important job is to keep this building, staff and students safe at all times. In the midst of the wide range of emotions brought on by the tragedy in Florida, we are more committed than ever to the safety of all students, teachers, administrators, and support staff occupying Glover School. You should feel secure and comfortable in the fact that we have a comprehensive safety and emergency response plan that has been thoroughly vetted through MPD.

Thank you for taking a moment to review the email I sent on Wednesday morning regarding the difference between a lockdown and a shelter in place. Please know that we are consistently reviewing our security policies, procedures, and protocols at both the district and school level. We have a security task force that meets monthly with MPD and we participate in regular training for all faculty and staff, regular practice of safety procedures and protocols with students, and security systems in place that cannot be shared with the general public but are strictly adhered to. Thank you for your support as we work together to ensure your child's safety and security.
