Dear Glover Families,

We had another fabulous week at Glover and I hope you all stayed safe and warm on Thursday. As you know, the social-emotional wellbeing of our students is at the forefront of our efforts here at Glover. On Monday, Mr. Powers, Mrs. MacNeil, and I had assemblies with every grade level. I feel it is important for you to hear some of the language we are using with students so that you can reinforce the same concepts at home. We discussed strategies that students can use to "report" (not tell or tattle- we reframed this) and be an "upstander". We talked about the importance of having a trusted adult (or a few) here at Glover. We brainstormed who those trusted adults might be and how they will be able to help students navigate tricky situations. We explored the difference between "bullying" and "conflict" and role-played situations to allow all students (K-5) to really understand what to do in a variety of complicated scenarios. The most important take-away for students was the emphasis on having trusted adults. I followed our assemblies with a staff meeting in which I identified the importance of being trusted adults for students and how our response to students who are brave enough to reach out must be consistent and supportive. It was a powerful point of conversation for both students and staff and in our constant effort to wrap SEL practices around our students, I wanted to share it with you. Please ask your child about who their trusted adult at school might be and what they learned this week. Thank you.
