<u>Social Emotional Learning:</u> Throughout the months of May and June, we will be focusing on Friendship Skills. This week, we learned about making amends and next week, we'll learn about Handling Name Calling and learn that the best way to handle name calling is to either ignore the person or speak to him/her assertively and tell the person that it's not okay to call someone names. If it doesn't stop, you should tell a trusted adult. Saying kind words helps us make and keep friends!

<u>Social Media and Digital Citizenship:</u> For those who were unable to attend the Katie Greer presentation last week, I've attached two documents that provide valuable takeaways and helpful tips when exploring the idea of parenting digital natives. I hope you find them informative.

Yale University Partnership and Implicit Bias Research: We are very fortunate to be partnering with Dr. Yarrow Dunham and his Social Cognitive Development Lab. Dr. Dunham is doing targeted work with MPS in the area of implicit bias. Dr. Dunham's lab studies how children understand their social worlds. Coming home in your child's folder today is an opportunity to participate in a Yale University research study to designed to learn more about how children come to understand the social world, specifically looking at how they determine what different people are like and how they cluster into groups.

Depending on age, children will be presented with scenarios either as written descriptions, as auditory stories, or will view the scenarios on a computer. For example, your child may hear about a case in which one child gave something to another child, or about how two groups did or did not get along. Children will be asked to discuss what they saw in the story and what they think about the people and groups involved. We anticipate that each child's involvement will require less than 30 minutes. There are no known risks associated with participation in this study. Although this study will not benefit the participants personally, we hope that our results will add to the knowledge about social development. The study will occur during normal school hours at a time arranged with school staff to avoid disruption of educational activities.
