<u>CDM/Diversity Committee Meeting:</u> Richard Pinderhughes, Psy.D., a Milton parent and VISIONS, Inc. Director of Programs will present an interactive workshop on 'Implicit Bias: Barriers to being Culturally Responsive' in what we do in our school community on May 2nd from 4:30 - 6:30 with dinner in the MHS library.

In order for any school system or organization to be most effective in working with students, staff, families and community, we need to be able to work with each other around the very real phenomenon of implicit or unconscious bias. This aspect of working effectively involves being open to the biases that we all carry into what we do and a conscious effort to create alternative options for more equitable interactions, practices and outcomes, particularly across differences, including those that include the difference of instrumental power (as in supervision, teaching, coaching).

This brief learning will introduce to participants how to identify and understand implicit bias, which is a barrier to the kind of cultural responsiveness that includes genuinely embracing, working with and continually learning about cultural differences. In examining the challenges impacting us all, we will identify and discuss the behavioral traps and barriers that can impede working effectively across difference. This will only scratch the surface on exploring and understanding Implicit Bias - we hope interest in the topic may lead to more offerings. Please join us.

LifeSkills® Training for Parents & Caregivers workshops: The LifeSkills® Training Program is an interactive, skills-based program that teaches parents how to promote positive health and personal development in their children. In one session, the LifeSkills® curriculum covers collaborative techniques that parents can use to reinforce their children's competencies in skills that have been found to reduce and prevent substance abuse and violence. Session is 90+ minutes. Sessions will be held on Monday, May 6 and Monday, June 3 at Pierce Middle School at 6:30pm.
