Dear Glover Families,

There is no happier feeling than having all of our amazing Glover Kids back in school under one roof! The walls and halls virtually smile as these happy children skip, bounce, hop, and walk through them.

All of our Glover Kids are back in the swing of things. Our newest Kindergartners have made an amazing transition to school and our first through fifth graders look like old pros sauntering in each morning!

Today, we held our Welcome Back assemblies and learned all about how to be a Glover Kid, the importance of being kind, responsible, respectful, and safe, what happens when you are recognized as being an exemplary Glover Kid, expected behavior in every zone of the building and beyond, and how to distinguish between conflict and bullying, how to report concerning behavior, and more. Be sure to ask your child about what he/she learned. This week, we celebrated our first 12 "Glover Kids of the Week". These students were recognized for their great "Glover Kid" acts and wore medals all day!

Of importance, we talked at length about having "trusted adults" at Glover School. We learned that trusted adults are people who make us feel comfortable and safe, people who we can count on to listen and help. We introduced lots of staff, from adjustment counselors to school nurses, administrators to support teachers, who might be someone's trusted adult. Please take a moment to ask your child who his/her trusted adult might be. We know that the importance of having someone a child trusts in his/her corner cannot be underestimated.

## **Dismissal Plans:**

Thank you for continuing to adhere to the following protocol when changing regular dismissal plans:

**Write a Note:** Please submit dismissal changes **in writing** to your child's teacher and send in with your child. This is important for many reasons but if there is a substitute teacher, there will be written record of dismissal changes.

If your plans change when your child is already at school for the day, you must **call the main office** as teachers cannot guarantee that they will be able to check their

email/personal voicemail during the instructional day. The main office will notify individual teachers of dismissal changes.

Please be sure **your child is aware** of dismissal changes ahead of time so that he/she is comfortable with plans for the end of the day.

Please **always** include either John Leazott (Grades 2-5) or Deb Mullins (Grades K-1) if your change in plans involves ASE (After School Enrichment). John's email is <u>jleazott@miltonps.org</u> and Deb's email is <u>dmullins@miltonps.org</u>. If your child is registered for after school on a designated day and you do not inform the ASE staff of a change in plans, your child will be sent to ASE as registered.
