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# **Glover Celebrates Boston Black History:**

Here is a summary of our Black History tour around Boston, celebrating people and places this week! We hope you enjoyed taking a peek at all of the learning we have done by viewing our classroom doors!

On Monday, we learned about the Edmonia Lewis Studio (Southeast corner of Bromfield and Tremont Sts. Edmonia Lewis was the first woman of African-American and Native American descent to achieve international fame and recognition as a sculptor in the fine arts world. On Tuesday we learned about Phillis Wheatley, one of the best-known poets in pre-19th century America. She was the first African-American to publish a book of poetry. On Wednesday, we learned about Robert Taylor, MIT's first black graduate and the first accredited African-American architect. In 2011, MIT established the Robert R Taylor Fellowship in the School of Architecture and Planning. On Thursday, we learned about William Gross, the City of Boston's first African American Commissioner. Gross is a 33-year veteran of the Boston Police Department. Throughout his career, Superintendent Gross has maintained a strong connection with the community, and has been awarded numerous awards for bravery, meritorious service and community partnerships. On Friday, we learned about Elizabeth Freeman, also known as Mumbet, who was the first African American woman to successfully file a lawsuit for freedom in the state of Massachusetts. This

case marked the beginning of a group of "Freedom Suits" that would ultimately lead the Massachusetts Supreme Judicial Court to outlaw slavery in their state.
