Our Key Club has managed to collect over 100 cards made by our students for our troops overseas through Task Force Bayonet. Task Force Bayonet is a group of over 900 National Guard Soldiers from Minnesota, Iowa and Illinois deployed throughout the Horn of Africa to support Operation Enduring Freedom. The task force provides security forces to military bases throughout the region. We thank them and all of our Armed Forces for their service.

### Flu Vaccines

Per the Commonwealth of Massachusetts guidelines, all students will be expected to have received a flu vaccine by December 31, 2020, for the 2020-2021 influenza season, unless either a medical or religious exemption is provided. Elementary and secondary students in districts and schools that are using a remote education model are not exempt. Please email documentation of your child's flu vaccination to your child's school nurse.

# Covid-Related Absences & Live Streaming

If your child needs to be home because he/she is awaiting testing or has been a close contact of someone who has tested positive, you should inform Nurse Coughlin ASAP via phone at 617-696-4470 x 5537 or via email at kacoughlin@miltonps.org. Your child's teachers will be notified of the absences and the need to live stream classes. Please note that this information is shared with teachers first thing in the morning, so if you inform us of your child's need to quarantine during the school day, you may not be set up to live stream until the following day. Students cannot ask teachers to attend remotely for covid or non-covid related absences; all requests are to be made by parents/guardians.

## <u>Intellispark</u>

We are excited to announce that next week all of our Milton High School students will be participating in a new program called Intellispark. This online platform will provide us with a personalized path for success for each student by identifying key SEL and well-being indicators. Students will complete surveys in 4 different areas: Student Engagement, Connection and Belonging; Social Emotional Well-being; Student Relationships and Networks; and "Get to Know Me". This individualized data will be critical in developing support plans for each student as well as providing us with school wide data on the overall well-being of our students. We plan to administer the first of these surveys during Advisory Period on Tuesday, December 15th.

# Class Attendance & Cameras

While we do not currently require students to have their cameras on in class. We ask that all students keep their cameras on whenever possible. This benefits your teachers and your learning experience. With new features in Google like Background Blur and the ability to select a new background, leaving your camera on has never been easier. It will help with classroom engagement and hopefully provide more interaction with other students and MHS staff. Please check in with your child to see if their camera is on during class, if it isn't, ask why. While we do understand that some students may be uncomfortable with their camera on, most are not and it does help with engagement, helps facilitate classroom discussions and interactions with their peers.

### Headphones for all MHS students

All MHS students were provided with a set of headphones at the start of the school year. Please continue to use your headphones for all remote learning sessions. ### AP Payments due Friday, January 15th

Taking the Advanced Placement exams is an important part of all AP courses; therefore Milton High School requires that all students currently enrolled in AP Courses take AP exams. AP Exams will take place this year Monday, May 3rd through Friday, May 14th, 2021.

Online Exam Payment is open now and will end on Friday, January 15th. In order to pay, students must know their Student ID #. We know that parents may desire to pay for their students' exams but we strongly recommend that parents and students are both present to ensure that the correct exams are paid for. Using the drop down menu please select all AP exams you are enrolled in and will be taking in May, and enter the number of exams in the quantity field.

This year, Milton High is pleased to be able to offer AP Exams at \$40/exam (\$20/exam if qualified for Free/Reduced Lunch), with the district paying the remaining cost. It is important that all students/families pay their AP Exam fees on time to ensure timely delivery and processing of all AP Exams. ### User Fees for Clubs & Activities

Most MHS clubs and activities require a \$25 per year user fee, with a per-student-cap of \$50. Now that our clubs and activities are underway, it is time to remind families to pay this user fee to ensure our clubs and activities can continue to operate!

Using the <u>MPS Online Payment Center</u> on the <u>www.miltonps.org</u> website,please select payment of \$25 for one club or \$50 for two or more clubs in the first drop down menu. Fill in the required information, and select all clubs in which the student participates from the drop down menus below.

Please note that if a club is not listed in the drop down menu, then it has been designated as a "No Fee" club based on the goals of the club. Students who have qualified for Free/Reduced Lunch are not required to pay club fees.
